The wine was entered into the Regional Marananga Wine Show on 19th August and was selected as one of the top 24 wines at the show, out of 102 entries. The wine won a Bronze Medal in the highly competitive Shiraz section, of which there were over 50 individual entries. This is an outstanding start to Brett's new project. The wine is entered into the great Australian Shiraz Challenge and the Australian Small Wine Makers National Show and we look forward to seeing the results from these high profile national competitions.

The wine label features a reproduction of the original watercolour of the homestead by an "unknown artist" painted in 1855 and includes a short family history on the back label. On a weekend now after conducting a large volume of auctions Brett looks forward to a sip of his own award winning drop.
